Iranian presidents serve four-year terms and are responsible for managing day-to-day governance and representing the country in international diplomacy. However, power rests with the Supreme Leader, who holds authority over the military, judiciary, and key aspects of foreign. Iran's geographic position, straddling several different regions—Central Asia, the Caucasus, the Middle East, and South Asia—has always made it a crossroads of civilizations and a buffer between major powers. But more than that, Iran's natural topography is one of the main reasons it has proven so.
