NEC Article 408 covers switchboards, switchgear, and Panelboards installation and applications. Section 384-16 (a) does not require a disconnecting means for a panelboard. In the main panel, the neutral and ground must be bonded by Main Bonding Jumper (MBJ) wire from manufacturer as crossover tie bar, but in sub-panels, they must be isolated. Never connect the ...

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
